What is Fine Arts 7?

Fine Arts 7 contains four main components: visual arts, dance, drama and music. Each of these will be taught over the course of the year.

How will these areas be taught?

Each term will be culturally focussed. Students will learn about visual arts, drama, dance and music by studying various cultures, and will produce a variety of assignments and projects. We will begin the year with a focus on First Nations arts, then we'll move on to study Egypt*, Greece* and China*.

Fine Arts 7 students will begin the semester by learning correct care of materials, classroom rules and expectations, and clean-up procedures. Students will also be expected to create a portfolio that will store and showcase their artwork.

***Students are expected to follow all rules for the care and cleanup of materials. Art materials are expensive and should be treated accordingly. If students are unable to do this, they will not be allowed to use the materials again. If students continue to disrespect materials, they will be asked to leave the class.**

The Principles and Elements of design and compositional guidelines will be taught at the beginning of the semester through a drawing unit. All students MUST complete all drawing activities and lessons. These concepts are key to creating artwork during the semester and are necessary for students who choose to continue in art in the following years.

Students will have the opportunity to work with the following materials:

- Drawing/Sketching (pencil)
- Painting (acrylic and watercolour)
- Pastels (oil and chalk)
- Pen and Ink
- 3D Art
- Pottery
- Pencil Crayon
- Charcoal/Chalk
