


Justice Wargrave

- pale eyes - Murdered 10/04/1920 Edward Seton


Vera Claythorne

Philip Lombard




- Killed 21 members of an East African tribe ?/02/1932

Miss Emily Brent




- 65
- sits very upright
- "righteous and unyielding principles" pg. 7
- closely set lips
- caused death of Beatrice Taylor 05/11/1931

General Macarthur



- old
- blue eyes
- tall
- soldier
- grey hair (short)
- neatly trimmed white moustache
- killed Arthur Richmond 04/01/1917

Dr. Armstrong




- caused the death Louisa Mary Clegg on March 14, 1925

Anthony Marston




- arrogant

- hair pulled back
- black dress - assisted with her husband's crime
- light eyes
- frightened look
